Service Officer Notes Jan Allbright



Tinnitus and Mental Health

That darn ringing in the ears! It distracts! It interrupts!

It annoys! And it also can cause you issues with Mental Health. There have been several medical studies that connect Tinnitus and mental health issues such as Depression, Anxiety, and Stress. Now why is this important from a Service Officer pointof-view? Increased compensation! Tinnitus is limited to a 10% compensation. But the associated mental health issues can be rated much, much higher! Frequent Depression can rate 30%. Anxiety can rate up to 70%. But it is important to be able to a) Service Connect the Tinnitus, and b) Connect the Tinnitus to the Depression/Anxiety.

Service Connecting the Tinnitus can be a bit difficult so it is very important that you have access to your military records. Having a Tinnitus diagnosis is essential. Having a Military Occupation Specialty (MOS) that often expose the trooper to high noise levels helps.

Connecting the Mental Health issues to the Tinnitus may be a little harder, but given the large number of medical studies, this should not be that hard. But again, a diagnosis is essential!


Final message – if you have Tinnitus then the chances are very good it is having a Mental Health impact on your life. Get your hearing checked and sign up for a Mental Health assessment.

- Ballots were mailed to voters request an automatic Ballot-by Mail on July 3.
- Voters may vote early in person or vote a replacement ballot from July 3-26 at the Yavapai County Recorder's Office, 1015 Fair St., Prescott, from 8am to 5pm 7351 E. Skoog Blvd., Prescott Valley, from 9am to 4pm and 10 S. 6th St., Cottonwood, from 8am to 5pm. All locations will be open until 7pm on July 26. Proper identification required.
- The last day to request an early ballot be mailed to you is July 19. Call 928-771-3248 ext. 9 or visit my.arizona.vote to request a one-time early ballot.
- Voters are encouraged to drop ballots in one of the 19 official ballot drop boxes located throughout the county. Do not mail your voted ballot back after July 23.
- Voters needing special accommodations can call 928-771-3248 ext. 9 for email voter.registration@yavapaiAZ.gov.
- If any Legion Family member needs transportation to an onsite voting location, please call 602-935-1936 to mage arrangements.
