Legislative Report

National Archives and Records Administration Backlog hurts Veterans

Many veterans have become frustrated in their attempts to get needed information and

records from the National Archives and Records Administration. These records provide information for funerals, job seeking, health coverage and more. It turns out there is a backlog of over 500,000 records due in part to the COVID19 shutdown when most of the workers had to stay home and were not able to get access to the records to work with them. During that time 72 workers who were working on site got the COVID virus.

Now lawmakers are urging the National Archives to digitize the records to speed up the updated information searching process. David Ferriero, the archivist for the United States said he hired an extra 100 employees to help deal with the backlog but estimated it would still take until the end of 2022 to get caught up.

With the resurgence of COVID especially in Missouri where the records center is located, there is concern that another shutdown would cause further delays in getting record requests taken care of. Six members of the House Committee on Oversight and Reform wrote a letter urging Mr. Ferriero to apply for funding through the Technology Modernization Fund to help with the digitation efforts. "It is critical that [the National Archives] use any and all available tools to ensure we can uphold our commitments to our nation's veterans," the lawmakers wrote.

Ferriero acknowledged in a letter to Congress this month that digitizing records was an important step to eliminate the backlog. He said the agency would begin digitizing records in August.

"Mass digitization will significantly enhance the [National Personnel Records Center]'s ability to process requests remotely in the unfortunate event of a pandemic resurgence," he wrote. In addition, Ferriero acknowledged that even though steps are being taken to start the digitizing of records, the entire IT infrastructure needed to be improved too.

Organizations (like our American Legion), the Veterans Administration has added three (3) more presumptive diseases to the Agent Orange list. These new diagnoses are bladder cancer, hypothyroidism, and Parkinson's Disease-like symptoms. Like all presumptive, all that need be proven is that you have the disease, and you were "boots on the ground" in Vietnam. If you are unlucky enough to have any of these diseases, I strongly advise you to contact your Post Service Officer and get the claims paperwork started!




